








With a wide variety of weighing instruments (% market share).


Vision and Mission



- o Furthermore, the LMG participates in the work of international organizations, such as OIML [International Organization of Legal Metrology] and WELMEC [European Cooperation in Legal Metrology], European Commission and others.

Permanent Working Groups:

o The BTG focuses on securing fair competition within the EU internal market, ensuring a proper and uniform control of instruments in service by the relevant authorities.

o To achieve this goal the BTG collects and analyzes market situation and advocates for the improvement of market surveillance, especially when it comes to customs
